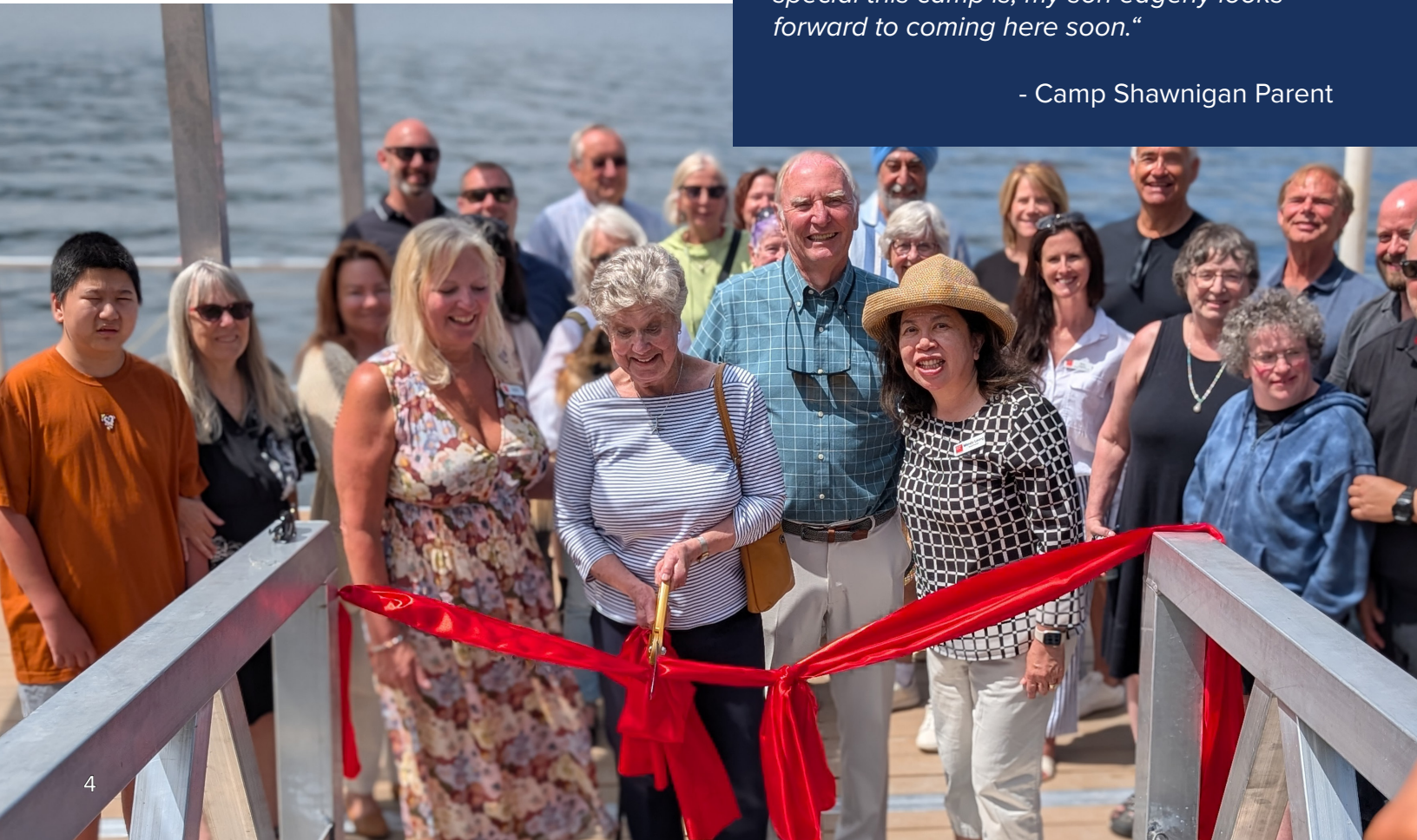

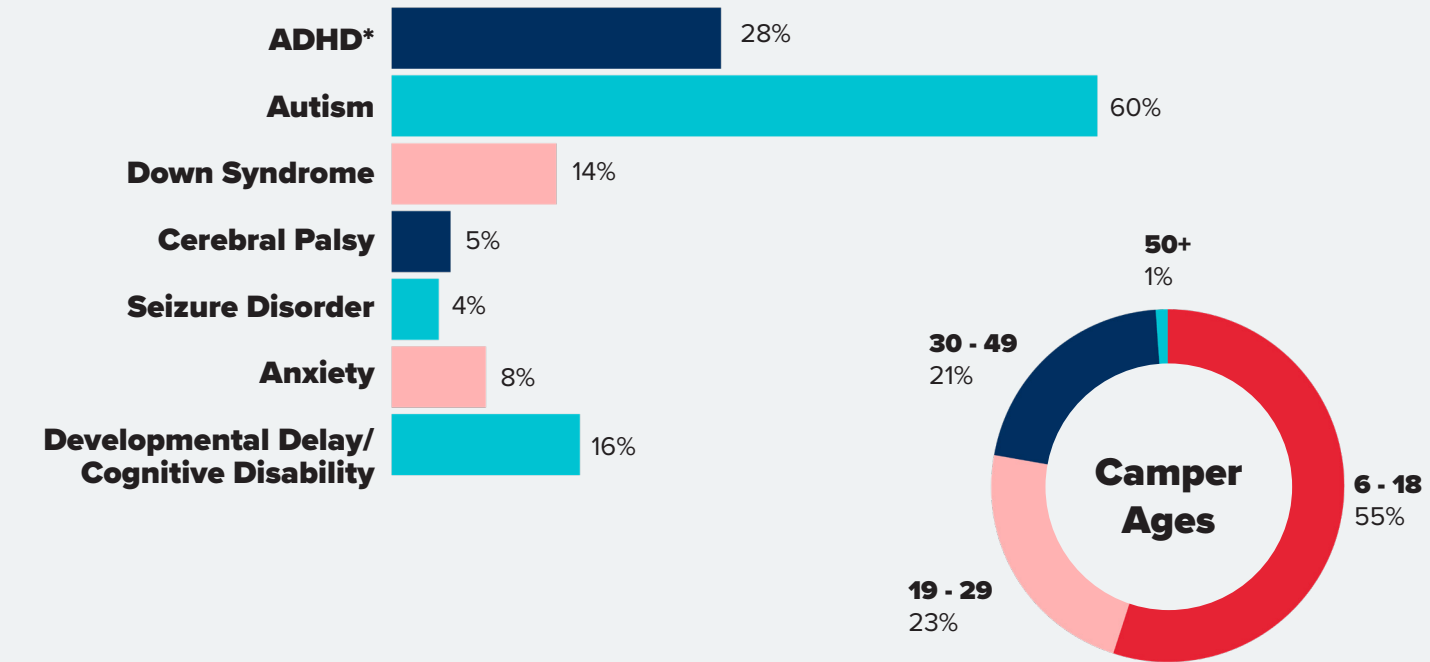
CAMP SHAWNIGAN

For many, camp is more than just a summer getaway—it’s a second home, a place where barriers disappear and every person is celebrated for exactly who they are. Each campsite is supported by a full complement of staff – from trained camp counsellors to 24-hour nursing and support staff. It is of the highest importance that family members and caregivers can place their trust in our camp to keep their loved ones safe and cared for. Camp is also an important time of respite for family members and caregivers, providing an opportunity for them to recharge and focus on other areas of their lives.

When Hannah first attended Easter Seals Camp Squamish, she was nervous about being away from home and unsure of what to expect. But over the years, camp has become her favourite place—a space filled with laughter, friendship, and new challenges.

From soaring higher each summer on the Big Swing to building the confidence to perform on stage with her ukulele, Hannah has found her confidence and joy in experiences that once felt out of reach. Each year, she reconnects with her camp best friend, Koko, and adds another tie-dye shirt to her growing collection, reminders of how much she’s grown and how deeply camp has shaped her journey toward independence.



“Camp gives Hannah full independence in a supported setting,” says her mom, Caroline. “It’s one of the few times she’s away from home, and it allows us to rest knowing she’s safe, happy, and thriving.”

For Hannah’s family, these moments are powerful milestones. Their goal is for Hannah to one day stay home alone for a weekend—something she’s not quite ready for yet, but each summer at Easter Seals camp brings her one step closer.

Today, Hannah lives in Squamish with her parents and their dogs and attends a local day program. She also works part-time at a pet store and a grocery store, saving up money for her hobbies and to attend camp.

Since 1955, Easter Seals House has been a lifeline for families traveling to Vancouver for essential medical care. The current lodge on Oak Street features 49 purpose-built suites designed to provide comfort, affordability, and a community of support when it's needed most. For many families, Easter Seals House is far more than a place to stay — it's a source of relief and compassion during some of life's most difficult moments. Guests often share how much they appreciate the warmth of the staff, from a friendly smile at check-in to a kind word after a long day at the hospital. These small acts of care offer a sense of peace and belonging to those far from home.

This year, Easter Seals House continued its commitment to providing a welcoming and safe environment for every guest. While our capacity fluctuated this year, the House was consistently full. Fresh paint and refurbished rooms have brightened and improved the space, ensuring greater comfort and accessibility for all who stay. Attention to detail and regular maintenance help the House remain clean, calm, and cared for — a true home away from home. Yet what makes Easter Seals House truly special are the people who bring it to life. As one family shared with staff, "It isn't just a place to sleep, it is a place where we felt cared for. Everyone here understood what we were going through and that's a rare feeling."

In the Community

The Caribbean Cigar Celebration

Now in its third year, the Caribbean Cigar Celebration, hosted by Davison North Law on August 16, brought together the warmth and vibrancy of Caribbean culture with fine cigars, lively music, and community spirit. This year’s event filled the Rocky Mountaineer Station and raised an impressive **\$45,127** in support of Easter Seals BC/Yukon, helping fund vital programs and services across the province.

Peninsula Co-op

Inspired by the impact that Camp Shawnigan has on the community, Peninsula Co-op contributed a generous donation of **\$10,000** to go towards financial assistance for individuals and families attending camp, ensuring that all can access an unforgettable experience, regardless of financial barriers. Their support extends to the redevelopment of Camp Shawnigan where their generosity and community spirit inspires so many in the Vancouver Island region.



National AccessAbility Week

National AccessAbility Week (NAAW) is a time to celebrate the contributions and achievements of Canadians with disabilities and to promote a more accessible and inclusive society for all. In 2025, the theme focused on **applying inclusive thinking and actions in everyday life**, a message that aligns deeply with Easter Seals’ mission to create opportunities for independence, confidence, and connection.

We launched a tote bag design contest for elementary and high school students, inviting them to illustrate what accessibility and inclusion means to them. The contest sparked thoughtful discussions in classrooms and inspired creative, heartfelt designs from young artists across BC and the Yukon. The winning designs were unveiled on the first day of National AccessAbility Week in May and featured on limited-edition tote bags. To further the conversation, Easter Seals also partnered with the Rick Hansen Foundation to host an educational webinar for students, teachers, and friends, exploring accessibility through real-life stories and practical ways to make communities more inclusive. We had over 600 participants attend the webinar across 5 provinces. Together, these initiatives helped raise awareness and inspire the next generation to build a more accessible future.

Access 2 Card

The Access 2 Card program, managed and administered by Easter Seals Canada, continues to make recreation and entertainment more accessible for people with disabilities across the country. Launched in 2004, the program provides cardholders with free admission for their support person at participating venues. From movie theatres and museums to cultural attractions and sporting events, the Access 2 Card helps remove financial and social barriers so everyone can enjoy shared experiences in their communities.

Over the past year, more than **5,000 Access 2 Cards were distributed across BC and Yukon**, opening doors to greater inclusion and participation in everyday life. With over 800 partner venues nationwide and more than 100,000 Canadians now enrolled, the program continues to grow and inspire change. Through collaboration with partners and community organizations, the Access 2 Card not only promotes accessibility but also helps raise awareness about the importance of building spaces that welcome everyone.



Disability Travel Card

The Disability Travel Card helps make travel more accessible for Canadians with permanent disabilities who require assistance while journeying by train. Offered in partnership with VIA Rail Canada, the card allows one support person to travel at a reduced fare while the cardholder pays the regular ticket price. By removing financial barriers and ensuring that travellers can have the support they need, the Disability Travel Card promotes greater independence and inclusion for people with disabilities across the country.

Celebrating a legacy of support
